THE WARREN FAMILY

The line of descent of Imogene Southernland Voorhees from the immigrant, Humphrey Warren.

1. Humphrey Warren, born Poynton, England July 7, 1632, third child of Edward Warren and Margaret Arderne and of Royal Decent through Earls of Warren and Surrey. He was reared as a merchant and came to Maryland with his young son Humphrey and was granted Feb. 12, 1662-3 a tract of 300 acres of land called "Frailty", in Charles County surveyed for him June 22, 1633, and was patented to him Aug. 4, 1664. He was an active Protestant, and was appointed a Commissioner of the Peace, Sept. 16, 1670. He died intestate in 1673 at his seat "Hatton's Point", Charles County and May 9, 1673, his estate was administered and committed to Thomas Howell, who married his widow. He was twice married in England, and his first wife whose name has not been found died before 1652. His second wife was Eleanor.

(1) CHILDREN OF HUMPHREY WARREN AND FIRST WIFE:

2...Humphrey Warren born about 1652, died prior to Feb. 25, 1694-5. Married first??. second Margery _____. He was appointed a Commissioner of Peace March 2, 1675, and was an active Protestant in 1689. Sept. 4, 1675, was appointed Colonel of foot in Charles County. He was one of the Committee of Seven of the Protestant Freemen which seized government of Maryland from the representatives of Propriety, Aug. 1, 1689, and was a justice of the quorum and a Coroner of Charles County, 1689. His will was dated Aug. 14, 1689, proved Charles County, Feb. 25, 1694. He gave to his wife, Margery, during life "Hatton's Point", 500 acres and other property to his children as shown below. The executors were his wife and son Notley, and the witnesses were Thomas Bufort, John Gooch and Elizabeth Dutton. (For children see forward.)

(1) CHILDREN OF HUMPHREY WARREN AND Eleanor ???

3...Thomas Warren died between Jan. 6, 1705-6 and Nov. 23, 1710, married before June 13, 1688, Mary Barton, daughter of Captain William Barton, Jr. of Port Tobacco Parish, Charles County, Maryland. Married second Jane ?? He was brought to Maryland in 1663. Thomas Warren received from his father's estate the plantation called "Frailty" where he resided at the time of his death, and which he devised to his second wife Jane. June 13, 1688. Captain William Barton conveyed to his daughter Mary and her husband Thomas Warren a farm called "Strife" in Charles County, Maryland. His will was dated Jan. 6, 1705-6 and proved Nov. 25, 1710, wherein he mentions wife Jane and children Thomas, Barton, Elizabeth, Sarah and an unborn child. The witnesses were John Lofte, Joseph Bowells, and John Harris. (For children see forward.)

(2) CHILDREN OF HUMPHREY WARREN AND MARGERY ???

4...Notley Warren born Dec. 16, 1675, died before Nov. 23, 1710. His father left "Hatton's Point" at his mother's death and personally in lieu of that bequeathed him by the Honorable Thomas Notley. (Thomas Notley was governor of Maryland 1676-1679, during the proprietorship of Charles Calvert, third Lord Baltimore. His will was dated April 3, 1679 and was probated in St. Marys County, April 6, 1679. In it he mentions his sister Katherine Grudgefield, of London, and William Nuigsinger, Ralph Smith, friend of Captain Gerrard Slye and Jane, his wife. Captain Matthew Payne, John Pearce also godchildren Thomas Notley Goldsmith, Notley Maddox, Notley Warren and Notley Goldsmith, daughter of John Goldsmith; he left to godson Notley, son of Benjamin Rozer, "Cerneadby Manor". Charles Lord Baltimore and Colonel Benjamin Rozer were executors and residuary legatees the witnesses were William Digges and Nicholas Sewall.)

5...Benjamin Warren born Jan. 23, 1682, died before Feb. 11, 1705-6 married Elizabeth Story. He inherited from his father part of "The Hills" and "Warren's Discovery". His will was dated Feb. 3, 1705-6, and proved Feb. 11, 1705-6. He mentioned wife Elizabeth, and son Humphrey and provides that is both should die the estate is to pass to "father Walter Story"; witnesses, Richard Morris, John Haley, Matthew Manfie.

6...Charles Warren born Nov. 10, 1684, inherited part of "The Hills" and 100 acres "Smoot's Purchase" bought of Edward Smoot, and 100 acres of "Wicomico's Fields" bought of William Smoot.

7...Humphrey Warren born Nov. 15, 1691. Inherited two tracts of land.

p92 8...John Warren born June 18, 1687, died before Feb. 13, 1713. Married Judith ?? His father left him 400 acres on west side of Wicomico River formerly belonging to John Gooch. His will was dated Aug. 12, 1713 and was probated Feb. 13, 1713? His wife Judith was executor and was bequeathed "Hatton's Point" and his daughter, Mary, "Rich Thicketts". "The Hills", and "Warren's Discovery" and his daughter, Anne, the tract of land formerly belonging to John Gooch. "The Tanyard" and "Smoot's Purchase", now in the

tenure of Edward Lloyd. Witnesses: John Maddox, Ale Contee, Thomas Lewis.

(3) CHILDREN OF THOMAS WARREN AND MARY BARTON

9...Thomas Warren

10...Barton Warren, of Charles County, Maryland a minor in 1705, died before March 9, 1757. Married Elizabeth?? He inherited from his father's estate the plantation "Frailty" and "Strife" which he devised to his sons and wife. He was Captain of a company of Colonial Militia, Charles County in 1748. June 8, 1752, with Edward Ford, he was assigned Pew #6 in William & Mary Parish Church. His will was dated Feb. 3, 1757, proved March 9 1757; in it he mentions his wife Elizabeth and his eight children; executors were sons Notley and John Warren; witnesses Charles Bruce, John Ford, William Brown. (For children see forward.)

13...Elinor Warren born March 7, 1690.

15...Ann Warren married William Dent of Charles County, Maryland and had: Ann Dent who married Samuel Brisco, and had: William Dent Brisco who married Sarah Stone and had: Walter Hanson Stone Brisco, who married Emeline Wellmore Dallam and had: Jeannette Eleanor Brisco who married James Richard Thomas and had: Jeannette Brisco Thomas a member of Maryland Society of the Colonial Dames of America who married James Bourne Purran of Baltimore and had: Jeannette Brisco Purran.

p93 CHILDREN OF BARTON WARREN AND ELIZABETH ??

16...Jane warren married Barton Hungerford, her cousin, son of William Hungerford and Margaret Barton (For children see Chapter XIII, "The Hungerford Family")

17...Mary Warren married first Harrison Musgrave of Charles County Maryland who died before April 29, 1760, intestate (the date of the bond filed in Charles County June 14, by his widow as administratrix, with her brothers Notley and John Warren as securities) She married second (his second wife), John Stone of Port Tobacco, Maryland. His will dated August 6, proved in Charles County by his widow Sept. 12, 1775. She removed with her children to Pittsylvania County, Virginia in 1779.

20...William Barton Warren born 1738, died at Georgetown, Kentucky 1809. Married at Port Tobacco, Maryland, Mary Jane Yates. He removed to Lancaster County, Virginia and then to Woodford County, Kentucky and had besides other

children: William Monroe Warren of Georgetown, Kentucky born July 1, 1775, died Feb. 22, 1824 and married at Georgetown, Maria F. Faunteroy born July 17, 1780, also of Royal Descent, and had: Anne E. (who married E.L. Johnson); Margaret L. (who married Thornton F Johnson) John F., Miria and William Barton Warren of Jacksonville, Illinois born March 1, 1802 married Ann Dorsey Price. (For children, besides others who died young, see forward.)

21...Susannah Warren

22...Edward Warren. This may have been the Edward Warren who deeded to Philip Jenkins, Aug. 19, 1783, 145 acres on Mountain Creek in Pittsylvania County, Virginia.

23...Robert Warren, born Sept. 6, 1742, died in Tennessee Oct. 26, 1826, having 19 married children alive.

Barton Warren Stone, born near Port Tobacco, Dec. 24, 1772, died at Hannibal, Missouri, Nov. 6, 1844; married first July 2, 1801, Elizabeth, daughter of Colonel William Campbell of Muhlenberg County, Kentucky and his wife Tabitha, daughter of General William Russell, Jr., of Culpeper County, Virginia and had: Mary Ann Harrison Stone born in Bourbon County, Kentucky, Sept. 12, 1805 and died Aug. 31, 1872 married Sept. 1821, Captain Charles Chilton Moore of "Forrest Retreat" Fayette County, Kentucky, who served in the Army in the War of 1812, born in Culpeper County, Virginia Dec. 1, 1789, died Aug. 8, 1860, and had: Hannah A. Ransdell Moore, born April 25, 1825, died May 11, 1890, married Oct. 25, 1845, John de Lafayette Grissim, M.D. of Georgetown, Kentucky born in Tennessee Jan. 27, 1818 and died April 16, 1869.

APPENDIX

The line of descent of Humphrey Warren from Charlemagne, King of the Franks and Emperor of Rome.

CHARLEMAGNE, born 742 died 814, King of the Franks and Emperor of Rome. Restored Roman Empire of West, married Hildergrand, daughter of Childebrand, Duke of Swabia and had:

LOUIS I, de DEBONNAIRE, King of France and Emperor of Rome, died 840. He was only surviving son at Charlemagne's death. Partitioned his Empire, France, Germany, and Italy. Married Judith, the Fair Maid of Bavaria, daughter of Guelph I, Duke of Bavaria and had:

CHARLES THE BALD, 823-878, King of France and Emperor of Rome. Married (second wife) Richildis, daughter of Bobinus, Count of Aldemir Walde in France and had:

JUDITH, the wife successively of (1) Ethewolph, King of England, (2) Ethebald, his son, King of England, (3) Count Baldwin I, of Flanders, greatgrandson of First Hereditary Governor of Flanders, and by her third marriage had:

COUNT BALDWIN II, the Bald of Flanders 879-918, Count of Boulogne and St. Pol., married Ethelswida (or Elfrida) daughter of Alfred the Great, King of England and had:

p96 COUNT ARNOLD I of Flanders (the Great) married Alisa (or Artela) daughter of Vermandois and had:

COUNT BALDWIN II of Flanders and Artois died 9-1, married Matilda daughter of Herman Billung, Duke of Saxony (961-973) and had:

COUNT ARNOLD II of Flanders and Artois succeeded his grandfather in Flanders and Artois, 964, died 988; married Susanna (or Rosala) daughter of Berengarius II, Duke in Spoleto, Margrove in Ivera, King in Italy 951, and had:

COUNT BALDWIN IV, Barbatous, or Fair Beard, succeeded in Flanders and Artois, 988, created Count of Valenciennes 1007, died 1034; married Eleanor, daughter of Richard I, the Good, Duke of Normandy, died 1026, and Judith, daughter of Duke of Brittany, and had:

COUNT BALDWIN V, surnamed the Pious, Seventh Count of Flanders (1036-died 1067) married Adela (or Alisa), sister of Henry I and daughter of Robert II, the Pious, King of France. Their daughter:

LADY MATILDA of Flanders, married 1053 to William The Conqueror, Duke of Normandy who was born 1025 died 1085. She died 1083 and was buried at Caen in Normandy where he is also buried. (Through this Royal House of England Plantagenet, Tudor, Stuart and Guelp derive their descent from Charemagne and Alfred the Great) Their daughter:

GUNDRED, died May 27, 1085, married before 1078, William de Warrenne. (the remains of Princess Gundred and her husband were discovered in 1845 in the ruins of St. Pancras Abbey and removed to Southover near Lewes, Sussex.)

WILLIAM de WARRENNE Earl of Warrenne in France, cousin of William the Conqueror, was created Earl of Surrey; Lord of Reigate, Conningsburgh; Lord of Bellencombe, in Normandy; born before 1036; Knight; Count de Warrenne in Normandy; Councillor in Normandy 1066; Commander in the Norman Conquest, Sept. 1066; Councillor of Regency March-December, 1067; High Forester to King; Joint Justicer of England, 1074; Honorary Brother of the Abbey of Cluni about 1076; founder and patron of Lewes and Castliacre priories; died June 24, 1089. He came to England with the Conqueror, and having distinguished himself at the Battle of Hastings, obtained an immense portion of the public spoliation. He had large grants of land in several counties, amongst which were the Barony of Lewes in Sussex and the Manors of Caristune and Bennington in Lincolnshire. So extensive, indeed, were those grants that his possessions resembled more the dominion of a sovereign prince than the estate of a subject. His Lordship was also highly esteemed by King William Rufus. Their son:

p97 WILLIAM II, Earl of Warren and Surrey, Lord of Lewes, Reigate, Bellecombe, Mortmer in Normandy; born before 1071; Knight 1071; Commander third Division King's Army at Bremule 1119; Governor of Rouen 1135; Witness King Stephen's second Charter of Liberties 1136. Married 1101, Isabel, daughter of Hugh the Great, Count of Vermandois, Crusader, brother of King Philip of France; (second husband, her first husband was Robert de Beaumont.) and had:

REGINALD WARREN who married Adelia, daughter of Roger de Mowbray and had:

WILLIAM WARREN who married Isabel, daughter of William de Haydon, Knight Con. Norfolk, and had:

SIR JOHN WARREN, married Alice, daughter of Roger de Townsend, Esq. in Norfolk, and had:

JOHN WARREN who married Joan, daughter of Sir Hugh de Port of Etwall in Derbyshire, Knight, and had:

SIR EDWARD WARREN, married Maud de Nerford, daughter of Richard de Skegeton and had:

SIR EDWARD WARREN who married Cecily, daughter of Sir Nicholas de Eaton, Knight, by Joan de Stockport, and had:

SIR JOHN WARREN, who married Margaret, daughter of Sir John Stanford of Wickham, Knight, and had:

NICHOLAS WARREN, who married Agnes, daughter of Sir Richard de Wynningtin, Knight, and had:

SIR LAWRENCE WARREN, married Margery (sometimes called Isabel), daughter of Hugh Bulkeley of Owre Com. Salop. Esq. He was born 1394 and had:

JOHN WARREN, born about 1414, married Isabel, daughter of Sir John Stanley of Latham, Knight of the Gates, and Steward of the household of King Henry IV, and had:

SIR LAWRENCE WARREN, born 1458, married Isabel, daughter of Robert Legh of Adlington in Cheshire, Esq. and had:

SIR JOHN WARREN, born about 1471, married Eleanor, daughter of Sir Thomas Gerard, Bryn Com. Lancers Knight, and had:

LAWRENCE WARREN, married 1491, Margaret, daughter of Sir Piers (called also Perkin) Legh of Lyme in Cheshire, Knight, and had:

SIR EDWARD WARREN, married 1516, Dorothy, daughter of Sir William Booth of Dunam-Maffey, Knight, and had:

p98 JOHN WARREN, married Margaret, daughter of Sir Richard Molineux of Sefton in Lancashire, Knight, and had:

SIR EDWARD WARREN, born 1563, married Ann, daughter of Sir William Davenport, Knight, and had:

JOHN WARREN, married 1594, Ann, daughter of George Ognell of Bilfey in Warwickshire, and had:

EDWARD WARREN, born May 10, 1605, was commonly called Stag Warren on account of his great size and strength. The wardship of him was granted in 1622, to Sir John Radcliffe of Ordfall, Knight, and Humphrey Davenport, Esq., and had:

HUMPHREY WARREN, third child, born at Poynton, England, July 7, 1832, died Charles County, Maryland, May 9, 1673. He was twice married in England, his first wife's has not been found; he married Eleanor??

The line of descent of Humphrey Warren from Edward I of England.

EDWARD I, KING OF ENGLAND, had by his first wife whom he married in 1254, and named Eleanor who died in 1290, and was the daughter of Ferdinand III, King of Castile and Leon.

PRINCESS ELIZABETH PLANTAGENT, 1282-1316, widow of Sir John de Vere, who married second on Nov. 14, 1302, Humphrey de Bohum, Earl of Harford and Essex, Lord High Constable, killed at Boroughbridge in 1321, also of Royal Descent, and had:

SIR WILLIAM de BOHUM, King's Guards, fifth son, created, 1337, Earl of Northampton, died 1360, who married Lady Elizabeth, died 1356, daughter of

Bartholomew, first Baron de Badlesmere, executed in 1322, and his wife Lady Margaret de Clare, also of Royal Descent, and had:

LADY ELIZABETH de BOHUM, who married (his first wife) Sir Richard Fitz-Alan K.G. tenth Earl of Arundel, beheaded in 1398, also of Royal Descent, and had:

LADY ELIZABETH FITZ-ALAN, died July 8, 1425, who had by her third husband, Sir Robert Goushill, of Hault Huncknall, County Derby who had:

LADY JOAN GOUSHILL, who married Sir Thomas Stanlel, K.G., Bbron Stanley, died Jan. 12, 1458, and had:

p99 LADY ELIZABETH STANLEY (a sister of Sir William Stanley, who crowned Henry VII, on Boswortg Field), who married Sir Richard Molineux of Sefton County Lancaster, killed at Bloreheath in 1459, and had:

SIR THOMAS MALINEUX, of Selfton, Knight Bannert, who married Lady Anne, daughter of Thomas de Dutton and had:

SIR WILLIAM MOLINEUX, of Sefton, died 1548, married Lady Jane, daughter of Sir Richard Rigge, and had:

SIR RICHARD MOLINEUX, of Selfton, died 1568, married Lady Eleanor, daughter of Sir Alexander Ratcliffe, of Ordsall, and had:

LADY MARGARET MOLINEUX, died 1617, who married John Warren, Esq. of Poynton, Baron of Stockport, high Sheriff of Cheshire, died 1588, second son, and appointed heir of Sir Edward Warren, of Poynton, Baron of Stockport died 1568, and had:

SIR EDWARD WARREN, Knight of Poynton, heir, Baron of Stockport, born at Prestbury, April 9, 1563, high Sheriff of Cheshire. knighted while serving with the Army in Ireland; buried at Stockport, Nov. 14, 1609. He married second at Prestbury, Oct. 16, 1581, Anne, daughter of Sir William Davenport of Baramall, Cheshire and had by her, who was buried at Stockport, July 13, 1597:

JOHN WARREN of Poynton, heir, admitted to Gray's Inn, London, March 4, 1609-10 died June 20, 121. He married (covenant dated Feb. 11, 1593, contract Oct. 28, 1594) Anne Ognal, of Bylkesley, Warwickshire, buried at Stockport, May 1652, and had:

EDWARD WARREN of Poynton, heir born May 10, baptized May 19, 1605 buried at Stockport, Sept. 10, 1687, will dated Jan.3,1683, proved at Chester in 1687. He was a Royalist and his estates were sequestered, but was pardoned in 1647. He gave the Herald his pedigree for the "Visitation" Sept. 17, 1663. He had by his first wife, Margaret Arderne, buried at Poynton, April 20, 1644, ten children of whom:

HUMPHREY WARREN, of Charles County, Maryland, third child born at Poynton, July 7, 1632, and died 1673.
